129/18 Minutes of the meetings held on 28 January 2019

The minutes of the meetings were approved by the councillors and signed by the Chairman as correct record.

130/18 Report from County Cllr Robert Lindsay – at the full County Council meeting a motion was passed to set up a cross party committee to investigate how to cut carbon emissions. Progress has been made on filling in potholes – all completed on Stackyard Green. Cllr Lindsay offered to donate £500 towards the Parish Council's ClL bid for equipment for the recreation field.

131/18 Report from District Cllr Clive Arthey – Local Plan

Last year I told you the new Joint Local Plan for Babergh and Mid Suffolk would be going through the second round of consultation ahead of adoption sometime this year. Unfortunately, this did not happen and second consultation has been delayed until the summer of this year. The 'revision to the timetable' now anticipates presentation to Council in June, followed by public consultation. There are then periods for preparation of the 'submission version' and a 'technical consultation' before Examination in Public. Adoption of the new plan will not take place until next year.

Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

The first bid round for CIL funding was May 2018. I was pleased Monks Eleigh were able to benefit with funds for the new village hall. Lindsey village hall and Cockfield Parish Council completed the successful bids in bid round 1. Bid round 2 applications approved include electric vehicle charging points in Lavenham's car park, funding for the Lavenham 'Community Hub' (former TIC) where Post Office facilities are also provided, and Preston St Mary village hall extension. Unspent bid round 2 funds will be carried forward to the next bid round this May.

2019-20 Council Tax

Band D council tax for the coming year is Suffolk County Council £1292 (+4%), Suffolk Police £212.76 (+13%), Babergh District Council £163.86 (+3.15%) and Monks Eleigh Parish Council £72.07 (+0.2%). Band D in total is £1740.82 with 74% of that going to SCC, 12.2% to Suffolk Police, 9.4% to BDC and 4.1% to Monks Eleigh PC.

BDC 2019-20 Budget

Included in the budget is another £25 million of borrowing to fund commercial property through CIFCO Capital Ltd. This will bring the total investment in CIFCO to£100 million split equally between Babergh and Mid Suffolk.

2019 Elections

District and Parish elections are on 2 May. The district elections will be for the new wards with Monks Eleigh in the new Box Vale ward grouped with Boxford, Brent Eleigh, Edwardstone, Groton and Milden.

Farewell

I will not be standing for election in the new Box Vale ward, so this will be the last Parish meeting I attend as your District Councillor. I have been fortunate enough to have been returned to serve you continuously for the past twenty eight years and thank you for the support, hospitality and respect I have received. I have known Monks Eleigh since my childhood in the 1960's and I will maintain a close interest in your village. I wish you all the very best for the future.

132/18 Public Forum

A parishioner made a request for a defibrillator to be provided at the village hall with public access at all times as the distance to the other at the shop maybe too far in an emergency. They cost approximately £1500 to install.

133/18 Correspondence

The Council resolved to support a defibrillator at the village hall and will earmark some money for this. A parishioner to investigate the possibility of leasing in conjunction with the village hall. To be added to the next meeting agenda.

134/18 Roundabout – The Council wish to write to thank Jenny and Angela for providing What's On for the last four years. The Council resolved to make a donation of £150 to Roundabout. Clerk to email Caroline Burt

135/18 Recreation Field

The Council resolved to instruct solicitors Holmes and Hill to register the playing field and Polegate field with the Land Registry at an estimated cost of £1000.

136/18 Yellow Lines at the corner of The Swan and Church Hill

Following an email from Highways, Clerk to ask for a price to install double yellow lines on the corner and how they would be enforceable. Also to ask if the Parish could do it themselves.

137/18 Grass Cutting Contract

Cllr Reynolds is carrying out the mowing as a volunteer until somebody is found. He will carry out a risk assessment and Clerk to check if third party insurance cover is included in the Council's insurance. It was agreed to stick the clear up dog mess notices to the litter and dog bins.

138/18 Grit Bins

There is some confusion about the location of the new grit bins and if existing grit

bins have been filled this year. Cllrs to check and report back so if new bins are required there is time to order for next winter.

139/18 Finance
