### 110/18 Minutes of the meetings held on 26 November

The minutes of the meetings were approved by the councillors and signed by the Chairman as correct record.

111/18 Report from County Cllr Robert Lindsay – not present 112/18 Report from District Cllr Clive Arthey – not present

#### 113/18 Public Forum

Concerns were raised about speeding traffic through the village. A car crashed into a parked car at 7am recently resulting in the parked car being written off. Would it be possible to install speed calming measures such as a chicane near the United Reformed Church Hall going towards Lavenham as cars speed up from this point. Clerk to write to Suffolk County Council to ask for support in traffic calming. Another resident explained that Speedwatch has been successful in slowing traffic but more volunteers are needed to be effective. Clerk to chase up Speedwatch. The majority of people found speeding are local to the area so do talk to people you know who may drive fast. Clerk also to ask SCC for double yellow lines on the pub corner of Church Hill and The Street.

The Council were asked again if it be possible to have a permanent SID camera as it is doing well slowing traffic as it approaches. The SID is shared with Whatfield and research has found it works more effectively where there is an element of surprise. A discussion took place about the bank partly covering the pavement near Millennium Green and it was agreed to have a working party to remove the mud and debris. Also, a request for the shrubs to be cut back further where the pavement swaps to the other side of The Street to improve visibility of traffic.

### 114/18 Correspondence

A complaint about dog fouling on the verge of Church Hill has been received. Clerk to report to the Environmental Protection Team at Babergh.

#### 115/18 Recreation Field

Clerk to contact solicitors Holmes and Hill in Sudbury about registering the playing field with the land registry.

### 116/18 Parking at Swingleton Green

Clerk to write to the residents explaining that vehicles may not be parked on the village green.

#### 117/18 Grass Cutting Contract

There is a possible candidate to do the mowing work. Cllr Reynolds to contact him. If nobody to do it by the time it needs cutting, Cllr Reynolds will do the mowing until somebody is found. Cllr Reynolds kindly offered to purchase and donate a mulcher to reduce the mess after grass cutting.

#### 118/18 Grit Bins

The new bins have arrived and have been filled – unfortunately they are not all in the correct places so when they are empty they can be moved to the correct positions to reduce how far volunteers have to walk to spread the grit.

#### 119/18 Finance

- **a.** All cheques signed and due for signing as itemized in the appendix were authorised by the councillors. The councillors also noted the income received since the last meeting and reviewed the bank reconciliation against the bank statements.
- **b.** The councillors agreed the budget for 2019/20 at £17,865 an increase of £72.00
- **c.** It was agreed to keep the Precept at £17,736 which gives the Parish a Council Tax Band D amount of £72.07. This is a small increase of 0.21% on 2018/19. The request form was signed by the Chairman, Councillors and Clerk
- **d.** It was agreed to increase the Village Hall precept from the Parish Council by 5% for 2019/20 so and increase of £123 Cllr Derry abstained from this discussion and decision

#### 120/18 Play Area Inspection Report

#### 121/18 CIL Bid

It was agreed that the Parish Council will put in a bid for the 123 CIL money in May 2019. Cllr Forrest has identified suitable companies and will get 3 quotes for the following: - adding a trim trail on the recreational ground with 7 pieces of

equipment, upgrading the children's play area with 1 or 2 pieces of additional equipment and resurfacing the children's play area.

It was agreed that the clerk will invite a representative from Suffolk Highways to talk about traffic calming. Cllr Derry will invite local organisations and groups to give a brief update about their organisation. Cllr Derry to email invitation flyer to Clerk to print 260 copies
