As you will know by now, stamp prices increased in January. 1st class is now 85p and 2nd class is now 66p. Normal letters to Europe are now £1.70 up to 100g.

A reminder that all large letter and packet mail to Europe must have customs declarations. Personal and Business banking is available at your Post Office, offering cash withdrawals, deposits, and cheque deposits. This service is available to most high street bank accounts.

Mobile phone Top-ups, Electronic key Top-ups and Gift cards are just a few more services offered here. Post Office Savings and Insurance Products information can be picked up at the counter or just ask me.

eBay and Internet buying and selling, are all helping to make this a viable and incredibly busy post office, so I thank all my regular and new customers very much. I hope it will not be too long before we are back to normal operating hours and fingers crossed, normal life too. Once again, my thanks to all my customers. Keep safe and well.



Why a Community Shop?


Why do we have a community shop and not an ordinary shop? For those villagers who have moved to Monks Eleigh in the past 17 years, the answer is that we did have an ordinary shop and post office for many years, that was located in what is now called The Telegraph Office, a short distance from the community shop.

That shop and post office was due to close in 2003, and when the news was announced, we did what residents are good at; we formed a committee. That committee, as well as many other villagers too numerous to name, and if I tried, I would no doubt miss somebody out, but they know who they are, immediately set about a rescue plan to keep some form of shop and post office going.

On the 19th of March 2003 the Monks Eleigh Community Shop Association was formed with the object being "for the benefit of the community, sustain, encourage, provide, facilitate or resuscitate retail enterprises and in particular shops." Membership of the Association was (and still is) available to all on payment of £1.00 for a share and a Management Committee was formed, charged with finding out how a community shop worked and equally as important where would it be: as a result of these efforts the shop and post office reopened in time for Christmas 2003.

Fast forward to 2021 and we are one of 372 community shops in the UK with a workforce of about 7000 volunteers with a long-term survival rate of 92% about double that of ordinary shops.

Our success is due to those villagers who 17 years ago worked tirelessly to get a replacement shop and post office together with the continuing support of the community as both customers and volunteers without whom no shop would exist.



If you are new to the village and want to get to know people and what is going on, what better way is there than by spending some time helping out and joining our band of volunteers. Go on, give it a go and you will be welcomed with open arms. In the meantime, here's to the next 17 years!



Invest in Your Shop

Your village Community Shop is a not-for-profit Registered Society (formerly known as an Industrial & Provident Society) that depends on the active support of the village both as customers and shop staff.

You can become a shareholder in your shop, which will give you a vote at the Shop's AGM. You can only have one share and that will cost you £1 but it will give you a sense of ownership of such a valuable village asset.
